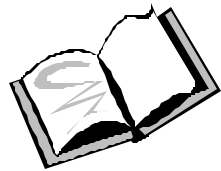


PNWD Library Committee?

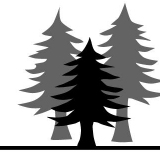

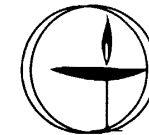

How To Use The Library

The Dorothy Spoerl Resource Library is a collection of books, videos and curricula available to member congregations in the Pacific Northwest District of the Unitarian Universalist Association. These materials are available for three-month loan periods free of charge to subscriber congregations. Individuals may also access the library by paying nominal rental fees for items.

There are two ways to access the library:

1. If you are a leader in a subscribing congregation (ie. committee member, board member, staff, RE teacher, etc...) you simply contact the librarian and request the materials you would like to borrow.
2. If your congregation is not a subscriber, you can pay a small rental fee and still borrow materials. Fees generally range from \$5 - \$10.

What Does the Library Own?

The best way to determine what the library has available is to go to the website at: www.pnwd.org. You can search the catalog – either by the book title, or by the category. You can also send a request to the district librarian, Mary Marsh at library@pnwd.org. She will be happy to help you find what you are looking for.

Become a Subscriber

Instead Of Paying Rental Fees!

We have a new way for member congregations to use the DSRL. If your congregation pays an annual subscription fee, you will no longer have to pay the rental fees for our titles. Instead of processing little \$5 and \$8 checks, you will instead, just pay \$25 a year and have unlimited access to the materials*.

Here is how it works:

1. Send in the subscription fee of \$25 with the form to the left.
2. Subscriptions will cover one year of library use. You will get a renewal notice at the end of the year.
3. Anyone in any leadership position in your congregation will be able to check out books from the library free of charge* (note exception below).

What is a Leadership Position?

Any committee or board members, religious educators, staff, worship leaders, adult education facilitators, ministers, etc....

**The only restriction will be in the case of excessive postage charges. If the postage fees to a congregation exceed the \$25 annual fee, we will ask for a reimbursement.*
