Book, *Remembering May Sarton*, funded by a Margaret Fuller Award from the UU Women's Federation, (2007).

Three separate compendia on her works in the following areas: spirituality, aging, and her vision for life. Researched and compiled by Beverly Anderson Forbes, PhD. Each resource is meant to stand alone and includes a biography of Sarton, a chronology of her life, annotated bibliography, discussion questions, and a list of supplemental resources.

Book, *Black Pioneers in a White Denomination*, Mark Morrison-Reed (Boston: Skinner House, 1980), 3rd ed.

Paints a painful yet important portrait of racism in liberal religion by telling the stories of many early black ministers; contains appendix with mini-bios of many African American UU ministers. On the MFC and RE credentialing reading lists.

The compelling story of two faiths that were finally united. Contains thorough biographical dictionary. On the MFC and RE credentialing reading lists.
